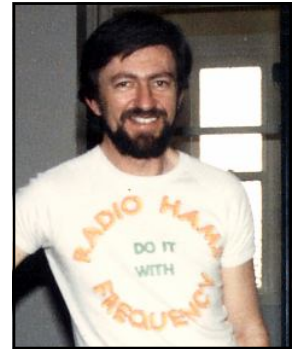


One of these days it would be nice to run a Branch 22 effort in the multi-op sections of these contests if there was enough interest.

Repeater:

Kaikoura – Redundant repeater & filters removed. Original batteries are still in service but condition unknown. Need for them to be checked & tested. Volunteer requested to refurbish filters.
Picton & Ward – Seem to be operating satisfactorily.

SAR:

Combined SAR Picton exercise will be held 18 & 19 June involving Coast Guard, Marina & Police. Blenheim EOC agreed for use of their Coms truck.

Brayshaw Park:

Paul has installed earth rods & bonded earth system all together. Also fitted hut frame hold-downs. FT1000 is available for use but still working on internet link. Triple Dipole antenna has now been installed but still needs trimming. Works on all HF bands but 80m has S9 noise level.

Also showed the new VHF digital hand-held that will supersede present hand-held although they have yet to be set up

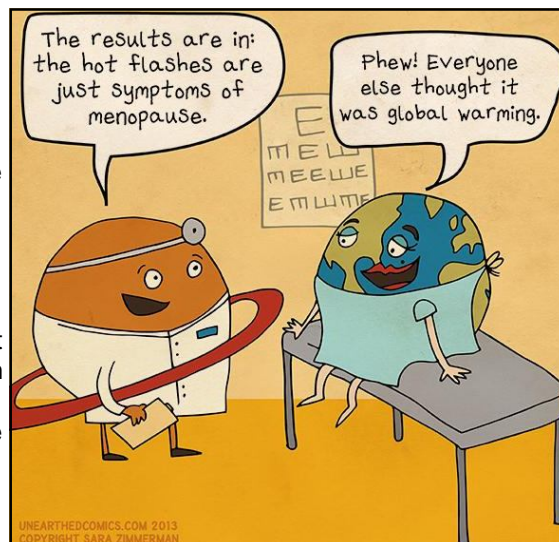

To fellow amateurs in the Marlborough area:

As you probably know, your Regional/District Plan is up for review. In my initial skim through the published Proposed Plan I could find no reference to Amateur Radio, nor Amateur Radio Configurations, but did I miss something?

Your club may already have a plan to make a submission to this plan, and if so, I would like to add my services to assist you. If you haven't yet made any such plans, then I would like to suggest that we make a joint submission from Branch 22 and NZART. The issue is that if individual submissions are made, and if they do not ask for exactly the same things, then Council sees conflicting requests and doesn't know quite what to include in their plan.

With the changing face of Health and Safety, and with a population that is better informed than ever before, it is absolutely essential that the Plan contains provisions that give permitted status to some core Amateur Radio Configurations (i.e. masts and aerials). Without that Permitted Status, every aerial we erect could be subject to a Resource Consent, which isn't cheap.

What I can do for you is to supply you with some samples of submission narratives, with some key requirements for Council to include in their plan, from which we can jointly produce a submission which is customised for the Marlborough area. What I ask of your club, please, is to provide me with a name or names of people who I can work with on this project.

The battery at Kaikoura will need to be tested as its condition is unknown and we will need to look into upgrading the solar panels to increase the capacity as well.
